
Learning Through Exploration

More than traveling and sightseeing, study abroad is a form of learning that takes place in a different country to learn in an immersive environment. It allows students to integrate learning with new cultural context. Study abroad programs can range from a few weeks to one year and can occur at any time during the academic year.

Did you know?

- Students who study abroad, in general, experience better grades, more confidence and higher graduation rates ¹
- 97% of students who study abroad find employment within 12 months of graduation from college.¹
- 80% reported that study abroad allowed them to better adapt to diverse work environments.¹
- Study abroad programs have an overall positive impact on the development of a wide range of 21st century skills including intercultural skills, interpersonal skills, and leadership. 3
- 85% of study abroad students reported studying abroad helped them build valuable job market skills.¹
- Study abroad opens career pathways and opportunities that had been previously unknown or unconsidered.¹
- 25% of study abroad students out earned their peers who did not study abroad by 17%.¹

| ◆ Communication | Study abroad experiences develop or improve intercultural skills, curiosity, flexibility & adaptability, confidence, and self-awareness to a significant degree |
| Course or major-related knowledge | Proficiency in a student's chosen academic major or course content |
| Flexibility and adaptability | Ability to adjust one's own behavior to changing circumstances and to work in ambiguous environments |
| ◆ Intercultural skills | Ability to understand and respect different cultural contexts and viewpoints |
| ◆ Language skills | Ability to communicate in spoken and written form in a language other than English |
| ◆ Problem-solving skills | Ability to identify and analyze work-related problems |
| ◆ Teamwork | Ability to collaborate with a diverse team |
