Washington State Operating Budget


- The 2015-17 operating budget (including the 2016 supplemental budget) provides a total of \$3.6 billion in state funds (NGF-S + WOPA) to support the higher education system (including financial aid).
- \$2.8 billion (79%) of this amount is appropriated to the public colleges and universities.
- In 2007 total higher education spending represented 11.1% of the operating budget. That decreased to 8.3% in 2012 before slowly increasing to 9.3% over the last four years.



Revenue Collections & Forecast

■ June forecast: NGF-S increase of \$308 million for 2015-17 and \$127 million for 2017-19 biennium.

"A great deal of the strength in collections stemmed from the housing market. Taxable sales of real estate and permits for new housing construction were both stronger than forecasted."

■ As of August 10, revenue collections since June are \$101.5 million higher than expected.

"Washington housing construction was stronger than expected in the second quarter." "Washington employment is expected to grow 2.9% this year, up from 2.4% in the June forecast...."
