As presidents of the four-year colleges and universities in Washington, we write to urge your leadership in enacting President Biden's proposal to double the Pell Grant maximum and to ensure that such an investment would be maintained going forward by making the increased portion of the grant an entitlement. This year alone, Pell Grants are providing more than \$406 million to make college possible for students from low-income families and those who are the first in their families to pursue higher education. 


