

Carnegie Foundation-Funded Statistics Pathway (STATWAY)

Washington's public, four-year college and universities recognize the importance of math pathways in the successful completion of a postsecondary credential. Upon completion of the STATWAY Pilot Project in July 2018, Washington's public, baccalaureate institutions commit to an alternative path to satisfying the mathematics admission requirement for students transferring from a Washington community or technical college.

STATWAY as an alternative path

- To be eligible, students must transfer directly from a Washington Community or Technical College with 40 or more transferable credits at the time of application.
- This alternative is intended for Washington community and technical college transfer students pursuing fields of study in the arts, humanities, or social sciences that *do not have a mathematics course requirement* for admission or graduation.
- Students are strongly encouraged to reach out to the potential transfer institution to determine if this alternative meets the fields of study a student wishes to pursue.
- The entire STATWAY sequence is required.
- High school students, Running Start students and students who do not transfer directly from a Washington community or technical college are not eligible for the STATWAY alternative pathway. These students must complete the established and continuing general requirement of completing a standard intermediate algebra course to meet the Washington minimum college admission standards to a Washington public baccalaureate institution.
