What You Need to Know	Next Steps
All of Washington's public four-year college and universities are: (1) permanently test optional. SAT and ACT tests are not required to apply for freshman admission. Not submitting an SAT or ACT will not disadvantage an applicant in the review process and (2) consider the whole student in the admissions review process. It is important to note that for many of the institutions these are “**priority**” deadlines. Priority deadlines are dates set by colleges and universities by which applications are given the most consideration must be received. Priority deadlines precede regular decision deadlines.
