Your student has a future with a Washington public university! This school year, your student will be notified about admissions to Washington public universities and eligibility for the Washington Guaranteed Admissions Program (WAGAP). Your student will receive a communication via email in approximately one week with further information.

### What to Expect

- **Check-In with Your High School:** Your student's junior year in high school is an ideal time to make sure they are on track to graduate and prepared for their next steps after high school. Encourage your student to review the [Junior Year Checklist](#).
- **Prepare for What's Ahead:** Help your student prepare for life after high school. Students should consider participating in activities, community service, work and classes that align with their interests. Discuss their plans with friends, family, teachers, counselors, community members, and admissions advisors. - **Multiple Paths to Admission:** Whether through general admission or guaranteed admissions, your student has options to apply and enroll at a Washington public university. If your student has questions, encourage them to contact the universities they are interested to learn more.
- **Paying for University.** We invite you and your student to a [WAGAP financial aid event](#) to learn about how to pay for education after high school. You will learn about the types of financial aid offered to you and will receive support on taking the first step to applying alongside Washington Student Achievement Council staff, the state's experts in financial aid.
